

You are invited to take part to help shape and influence the design and planning of a new community

Following a series of productive discussions with various interest groups earlier this year, the team working with Eastleigh Borough Council are pleased to invite you to take part in a series of workshop events to develop the design and planning ideas further. The aim of these events is to allow more detailed contributions to the design and planning process from those communities that live close to the land identified for new homes.

The Eastleigh Borough Council Local Plan is currently being tested through an examination process, and includes land known as the Strategic Growth Option (SGO) to help meet housing needs over the next twenty years and beyond. The Local Plan, if found sound, will allocate land north of Bishopstoke and Fair Oak for a new community of around 5,300 new homes and planned infrastructure.

The workshop events will comprise a series of tasks and other activities that will address issues such as:

- the land use mix for the new neighbourhoods
- access and movement issues
- landscape, green spaces and recreation opportunities
- the architecture and the design of new homes

The first event (Thurs 17th Oct) will explore the big ideas and establish design principles while the second event (Thurs 14th Nov) will examine the topics in more detail. You are invited to take part in both events.

Please note that at each event the evening session will be a repeat of the afternoon session. It is therefore not necessary to attend both sessions on one day.

The team running these events are keen to have as many interested groups as possible represented, although venue capacity may limit participation in some instances.
